### AM I ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible you will be studying or working in WA in 2021 and able to demonstrate a commitment to or an interest in pursuing a rural generalist career. In addition, one of the following will apply:

- Registered with the Medical Board of Australia and employed by the WA Country Health Service in 2021; or
- Accepted to one of the following training programs:
  - Australian General Practice Training (Rural or Rural Generalist)
  - Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine Independent Pathway
  - Royal Australian College of General Practitioners Practice Experience Program
  - Remote Vocational Training Scheme; or
- A final year medical student participating in a rural town placement with the Rural Clinical School of WA in 2021; or
- Employed by a participating metropolitan health service and accepted to the Department of Health GP Pilot with rural intent.
